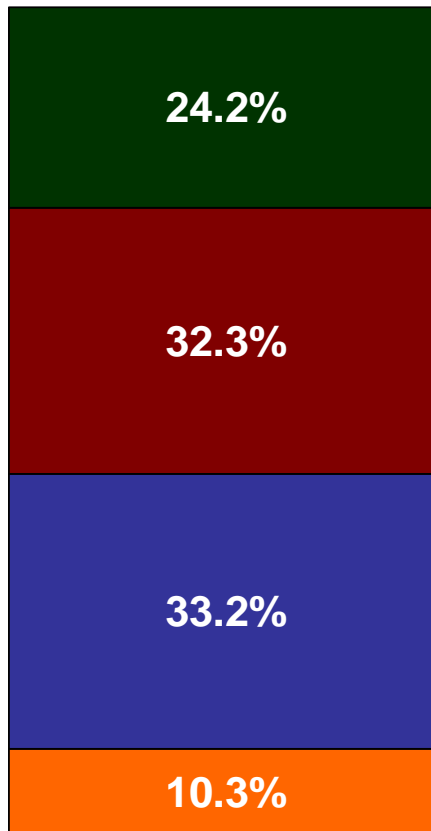

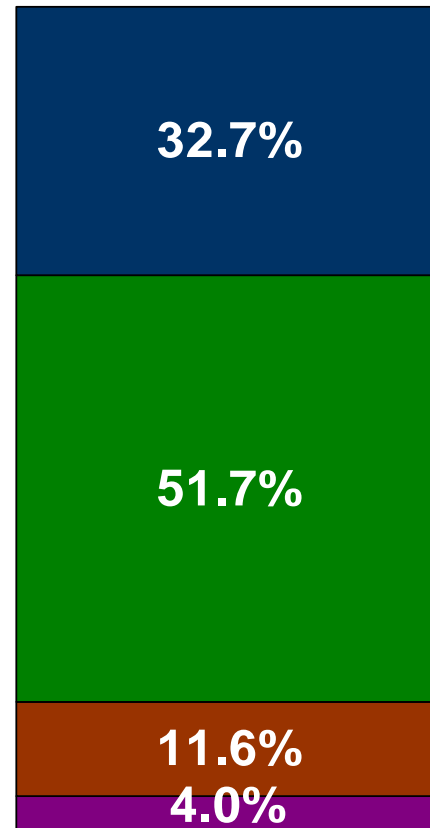

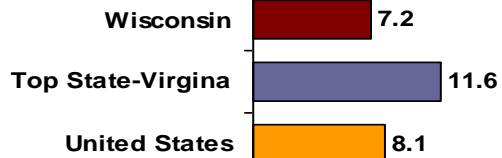


Percentages of College Educated Workers in the Workforce

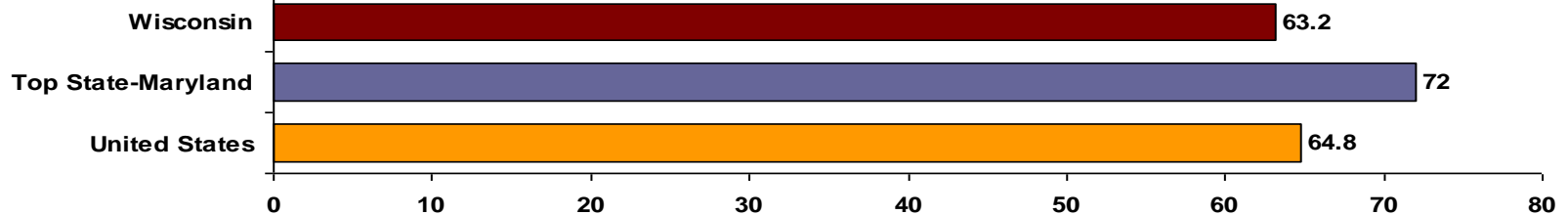
Percent of workers earning low wages



High tech occupations

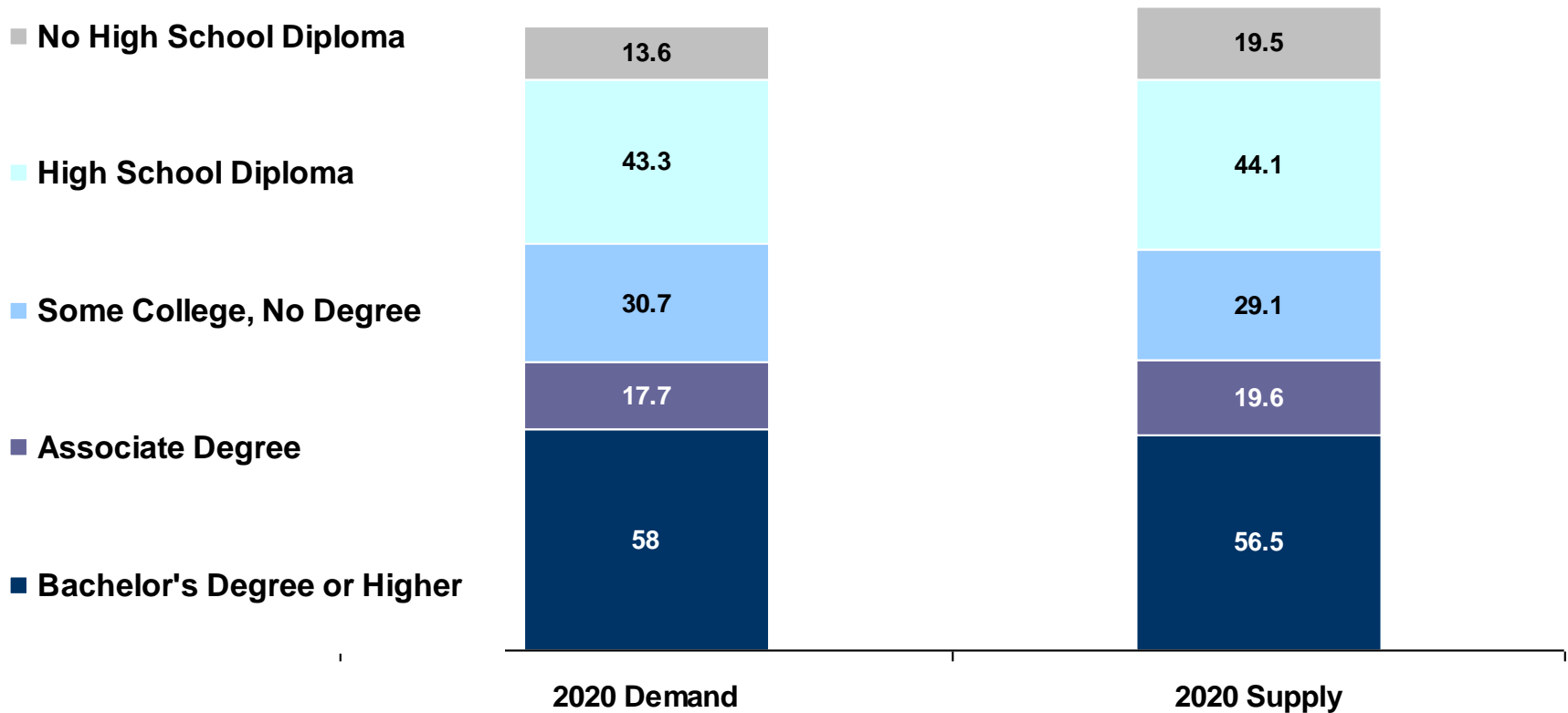

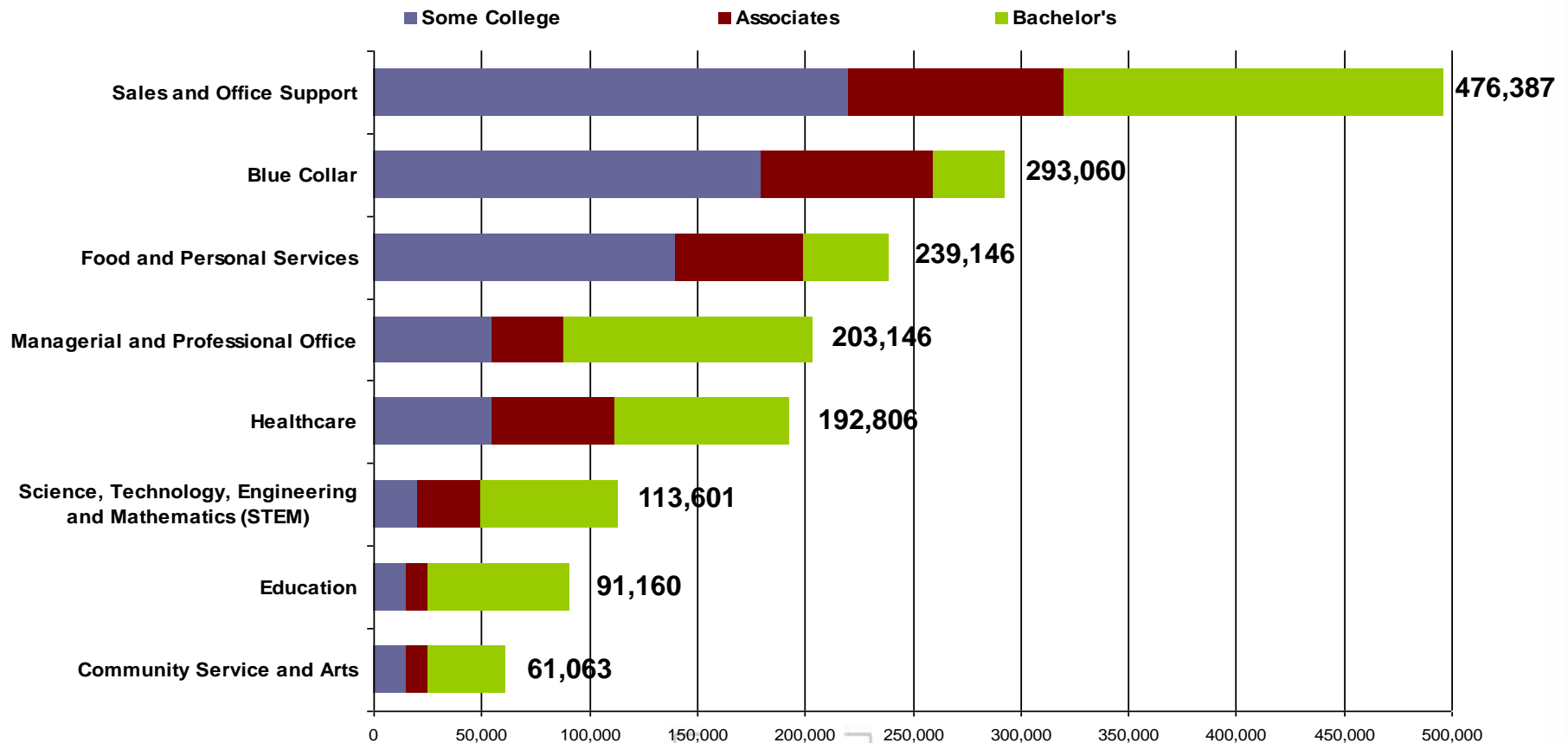


Demand vs. Supply – 2020 Projections (High-growth demand scenario)





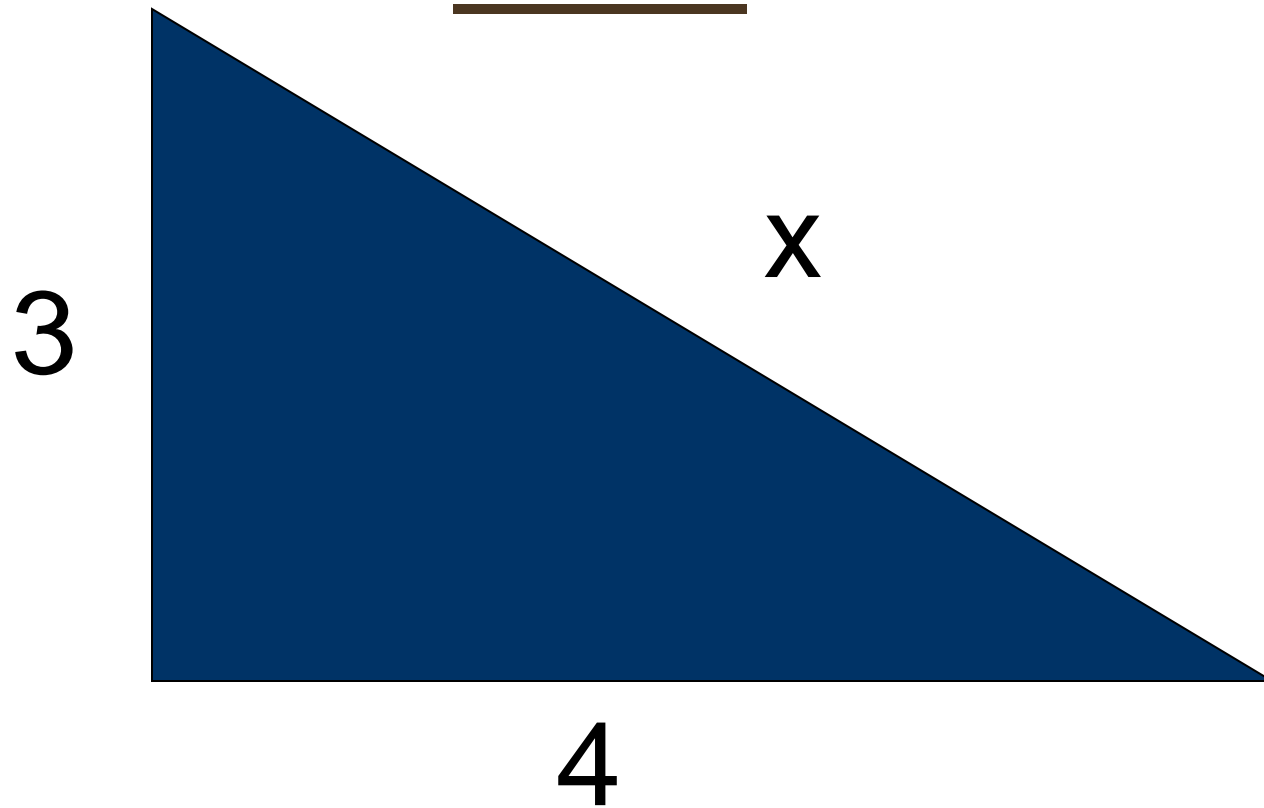
Estimated Number of Undergraduate Credentials Needed to Meet Workforce Demands in Wisconsin by 2018



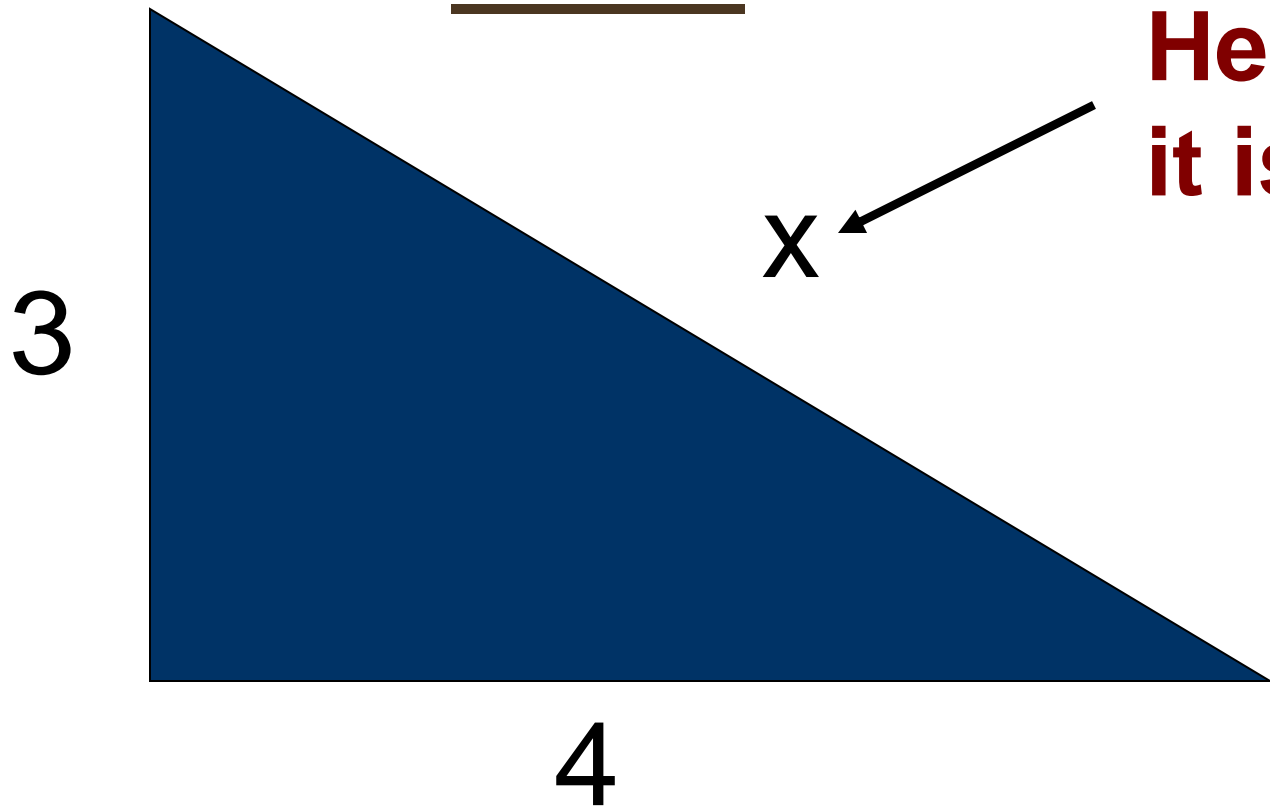

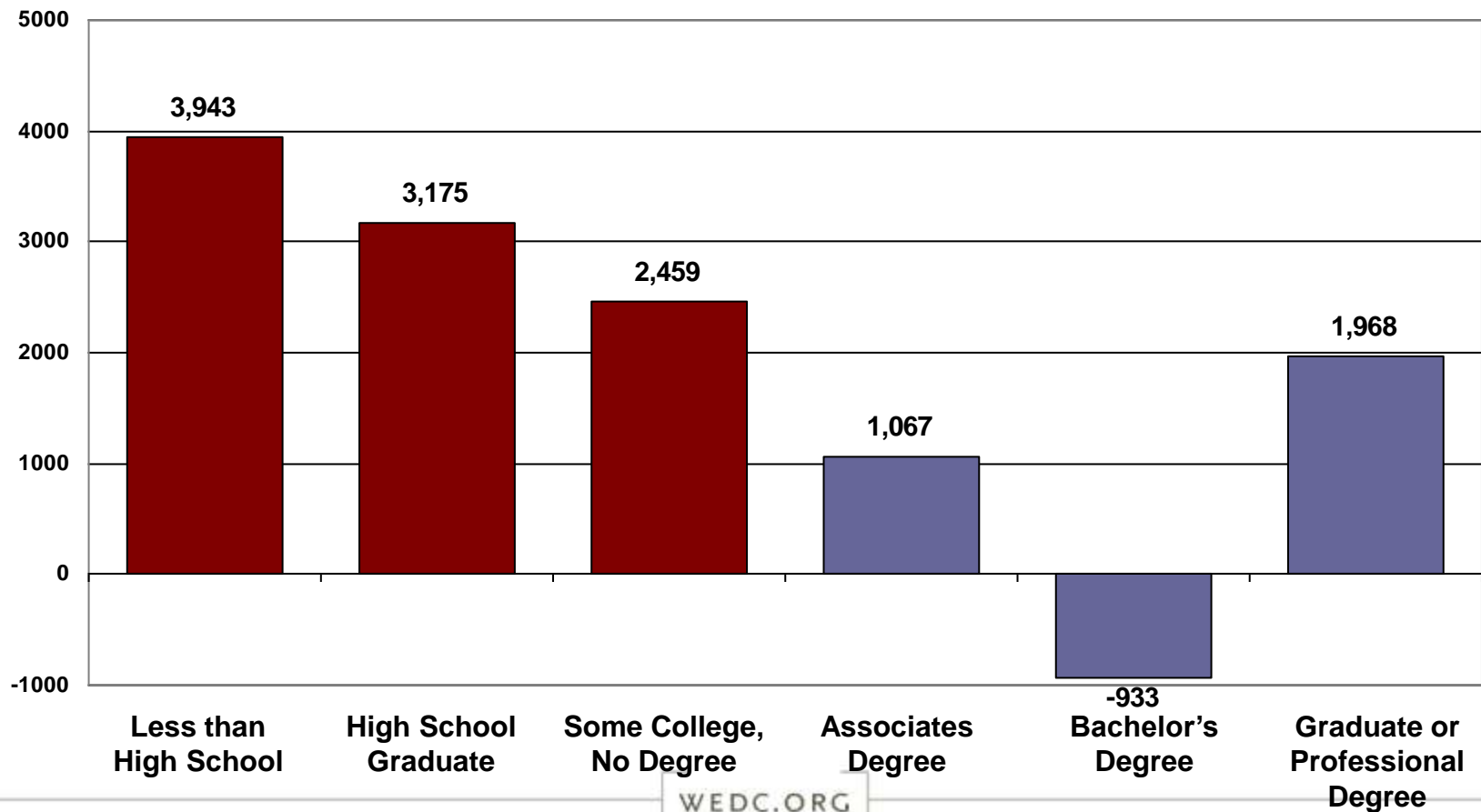
